


Amisk School Info!

Class Happenings!

Kindergarten

Wow, the end of October! October has been a very busy month in the Kindergarten classroom. The students have been working so hard on learning their uppercase letters and sounds.. The students know 6 new sight words. In math we have finished up our pattern unit and have started learning all about numbers in our number unit. In Social we are learning about being unique. In Health we have learned about bus safety, fire safety and Halloween safety. We are so excited about dressing up in our Halloween costumes and having our Halloween Party!! We will be painting pumpkins in Kindergarten on Thursday! We wish everyone a very Happy and Safe Halloween from the Kindergarten Room. November will be packed full of fun and learning!!

Grade One

This month in grade one literacy we finished our letter review! Students have started reading short stories and completing 1-2 sentence journal responses. Students have become Heggerty Stars and are enjoying our phonemic awareness tasks each day! In math we have continued our count to 100 and have been learning to represent numbers in many different ways. This month we reached number 38! Students completed units in counting, addition and subtraction to 10 and have recently started a unit on patterns! In Science we have started a unit on Investigating Properties and Changes! We have learned to define an object and use our senses to explore the world around us! During Social, we completed a mini Unit on *Me on the Map! This was an intro-duction activity to our very exciting virtual field trip around Alberta. We have started exploring all of the larger than life sculptures and attractions in communities around the province!*

This month was very special in our health and wellness world as we have had two new programs start in our Classroom. Miss Hailey is leading our Brite program and Miss. Aime, Roots of Empathy! In our own classroom health program we have completed our Growth Mindset tasks and begun learning about some big ideas such as dreams, goals, peace, compassion, patience and our many complex emotions!

PE and music have been so much fun leading up to Halloween with themed games and songs!

Grade Two

During the month of October we have been working on long vowel words (cake, robe, bike, tube, etc.) which we call 'mommy e' words. We have been working at becoming fluent readers with our weekly passages. We have also created pumpkins on our chromebooks and are wrapping up writing descriptively about them. In math we have been working on repeating patterns where the students have been building and recognizing patterns with up to 4 elements. They are also working on increasing patterns where they will be using pictures, numbers, words and sounds to create, reproduce, and extend. In Science, we have been looking at First Nation, Metis and Inuit objects and the materials they use. The students have been doing a great job identifying the natural and processed materials. In social we are learning about the culture, geography, daily life, and traditions of the Acadians of Meteghan, Nova Scotia!

Grade Three

October has came and went in a flash and we have been busy learning in Grade 3. In Math we have moved onto learning about the place value of numbers to 10,000. Our writing in Language Arts has been focused around descriptive writing when working on our Monster exchange projects. Students are describing a monster they have created in such detail that a partner should be able to draw it without ever seeing it. They are also creating a book review about our first read aloud of the year "A Stranger at Home". In science we have been focusing on our Matter unit and investigating the 3 states of matter. Social has taken us on a trip to India and students have enjoyed comparing life in India to our life in Canada. We are looking forward to more class auctions, our Halloween party and continuing the BRITE program in health with Mrs. Norman.

Welcome back to school students and families! The Scholastic Reading Club is now available for the 2022-23 school year. At the start of this month one member from each family should have received a paper copy of our scholastic flyer. The online version of the flyer (Digi-flyer) will be included in each month's newsletter as well as sent by email for easy online ordering.

If you are new to Scholastic you will need to sign up an account online.

To set up a new account, go to <u>scholastic.ca/rc/digiflyer</u>. On the left side click Reading Club, then click Create an Account. Follow the links and instructions. Purchases are by credit card; no more cheques are to be made to Scholastic Canada

It is important to note scholastic is no longer accepting payment by cheque; a credit card will now be required to pay for any Scholastic orders.



By using the code **RC272526** you can support the Amisk School and help us to buy books for our students! All orders will require the code when you get to the cart to checkout and it will remain the same for the entire year.

Report cards and Parent Portal Information 2023-24

This year we will be continuing with online grade reporting. <u>If you have not already please make sure you</u> <u>register to access your child's report cards by calling Ashley at the office!</u>

Frequently Asked Questions:

- 1. Will there still be printed copies of report cards for each reporting period? No, there will not be printed copies of report cards sent home for each reporting period for Grades 1-3.
- 2. When are the reporting periods for Kindergarten? There are 3 reporting periods; December, March and June.
- 3. Will there still be Student-led Conferences (Parent-Teacher Interviews)? Yes, Amisk School and BTPS believe that parent-teacher communication is vital in our quest to maximize student learning. There will be interviews scheduled in the fall and spring.
- 4. How do I get the information I need to set up a BTPS Parent Portal account? Contact your child's school to verify your e-mail address in our software program and let them know the child/children you are needing to set up an account for. The school will then request the Student Information Services Department to email the information to you.
- 5. Do I need a different account for each child? No, you will be able to create one account, choosing your own username and password. Once you are logged in, you will be able to access all the children that you linked to the account.
- 6. Can parents each have their own account? Yes, as long as the accounts are not created with the same email address.
- 7. Can students access the portal? Yes, they log in to the same portal, but they use their BTPS network login. They do not need to request information to create an account and they only see their data, not data of siblings.
- 8. Is the BTPS Parent Portal only available as web pages? No, there is also a mobile app called PowerSchool Mobile which is available for download in the App Store or on Google Play. Our district code for the app is GFST.
- 9. What information can I see in the BTPS Parent Portal? You will be able to see attendance, marks, comments, teacher email addresses, BTPS Transportation fees and BTPS tuition fees (not individual school fees), student demographic information, public messages on the School Bulletin and general school information.
- 10. Why is BTPS moving to electronic reporting of marks? There are a number of reasons:
 - * 24/7 access to mark and comment information will promote student-parent-teacher teamwork based on current assessment data.
 - * Mark and comment data will be accurate, timely and informative.
 - * Teachers will be commenting on individual assignments to give guidance for upcoming assignments: effective and timely feedback is a critical component of success.
 - * Alberta Education and post-secondary institutions are moving to electronic reporting and we want to help prepare parents and students.
