Class Happenings!

Kindergarten

Wow, the end of October! October has been a very busy month in the Kindergarten classroom. The students have been working so hard on learning their uppercase letters and sounds.. The students know 7 new sight words. In math we are just finishing up our pattern unit and ready to start our number unit. In Social we are learning about being unique. In health we have learned about bus safety, fire safety and Halloween safety. We are so exciting about dressing up in our Halloween costumes and having our Halloween Party.!! We painted pumpkins and the Kindergarten student's did awesome! We wish everyone a very Happy and Safe Halloween from the Kindergarten Room. November will be packed full of fun and learning!!

Grade One

The weeks are flying by! We finished our first writing unit and they LOVED sharing their stories with each other! We learned all about different word families (an, am, ig, ip, ag, ot, en, ed, ug, un, etc). They are getting really good with their short vowel sounds and starting to get the hang of writing CVC words (cat, map, did, lug, etc). We have started to learn some reading strategies (previewing a book for words we already know, looking for word family chunks when trying to sound out a word, making predictions before and during reading, and making sure our reading makes sense). We will continue to expand on these strategies throughout the year and learn more reading strategies to develop comprehension, accuracy, fluency, and vo-cabulary. In math we finished up our patterns unit and are now working on learning numbers to 20. Students will count forwards and backwards to 20, build numbers to 20, compare numbers to 20, and lots more! In Social Studies we are exploring communities and groups that we belong to. In Science we are exploring colours and seasonal changes.

Grade Two

This month in grade 2 has been busy! In language arts we have been reviewing short vowel sounds, working at our sight words and practicing our reading through daily 5. We have also been working at descriptive writing. It has been a lot of fun thinking of juicy words to make our writing more exciting. In math we have finished up our unit on Patterns and have moved onto the unit 'Numbers to 100.' In this unit, the students will be exploring how to count, build, and represent numbers to 100 in a variety of ways. Magnet fun has been happening in science this month. We are finishing up our unit with building a toy that uses a magnet in some way. This class sure is creative! In social we are wrapping up our unit on mapping and will be starting to learn about the culture, geography, daily life, and traditions of the Acadians of Meteghan, Nova Scotia!

Grade Three

Welcome fall! I am really enjoying my time with the grade 3 class. They are eager to learn and love to share their ideas. Sharing pages have been an excellent way to practice our read aloud and public speaking skills. Thanks for all the hard work at home! In math we are working on our number sense using the new Mathology program. In science we will continue to learn about rocks and minerals. In social studies students have been enjoying to learn what life is like in India. Language arts this month we will be continuing with words their way and will begin descriptive writing unit with a fun monster themed project. We will continue writing letters to our pen pals in consort. Have a great month everyone!

The online version of the flyer (Digi-flyer) will be included in each month's newsletter as well as sent by email for easy online ordering.

If you are new to Scholastic you will need to sign up an account online.

To set up a new account, go to <u>scholastic.ca/rc/digiflyer</u>. On the left side click Reading Club, then click Create an Account. Follow the links and instructions. Purchases are by credit card; no more cheques are to be made to Scholastic Canada

It is important to note scholastic is no longer accepting payment by cheque; a credit card will now be required to pay for any Scholastic orders.



By using the code **RC203472** you can support the Amisk School and help us to buy books for our students! All orders will require the code when you get to the cart to checkout and it will remain the same for the entire year.

All purchases will be sent directly to your home or the post office.

Report cards and Parent Portal Information 2021-22

This year we will be continuing with online grade reporting. <u>If you have not already please make sure you</u> register to access your child's report cards by calling Patti at the office!

Frequently Asked Questions:

- 1. Will there still be printed copies of report cards for each reporting period? No, there will not be printed copies of report cards sent home for each reporting period for Grades 1-3.
- 2. When are the reporting periods for Kindergarten? There are 3 reporting periods; December, March and June.
- 3. Will there still be Student-led Conferences (Parent-Teacher Interviews)? Yes, Amisk School and BTPS believe that parent-teacher communication is vital in our quest to maximize student learning. There will be interviews scheduled in the fall and spring.
- 4. How do I get the information I need to set up a BTPS Parent Portal account? Contact your child's school to verify your e-mail address in our software program and let them know the child/children you are needing to set up an account for. The school will then request the Student Information Services Department to email the information to you.
- 5. Do I need a different account for each child? No, you will be able to create one account, choosing your own username and password. Once you are logged in, you will be able to access all the children that you linked to the account.
- 6. Can parents each have their own account? Yes, as long as the accounts are not created with the same email address.
- 7. Can students access the portal? Yes, they log in to the same portal, but they use their BTPS network login. They do not need to request information to create an account and they only see their data, not data of siblings.
- 8. Is the BTPS Parent Portal only available as web pages? No, there is also a mobile app called PowerSchool Mobile which is available for download in the App Store or on Google Play. Our district code for the app is GFST.
- 9. What information can I see in the BTPS Parent Portal? You will be able to see attendance, marks, comments, teacher email addresses, BTPS Transportation fees and BTPS tuition fees (not individual school fees), student demographic information, public messages on the School Bulletin and general school information.
- 10. Why is BTPS moving to electronic reporting of marks? There are a number of reasons:
 - * 24/7 access to mark and comment information will promote student-parent-teacher teamwork based on current assessment data.
 - * Mark and comment data will be accurate, timely and informative.
 - * Teachers will be commenting on individual assignments to give guidance for upcoming assignments: effective and timely feedback is a critical component of success.
 - * Alberta Education and post-secondary institutions are moving to electronic reporting and we want to help prepare parents and students.
