

Kindergarten

Wow, March has flown by. The kindergarten students have had a very busy month. They enjoyed Teacher's Pet Presentation and learned a lot about numbers. The Ski Trip was an excellent experience for the Kindergarten students. They were great skiers. St. Patrick's day started off with a very messy classroom from the Leprechauns that visited Amisk School. The rest of the day was fun with games and party activities. The Kindergarten students have been working hard on learning to print their lowercase letters and working on their sight words. In Math, the students have started the Measurement unit and are measuring everything in the classroom. In gym class the students have been doing gymnastics, and having lots of fun. April will be a great month with lots of learning and fun activities. Hope everyone is enjoying Spring!!

Grade One

What a busy month! The ski trip was a big hit! We also had teachers pet where the students built enclosures for a zoo animal. On Saint Patrick's Day a pesky Leprechaun visited our classroom and made a big mess! He escaped all of our traps, but left us a yummy treat. We finished up our subtraction within 10 unit and the students really got the hang of taking away a part from a bigger number (the whole). We read lots of non fiction books and talked about how good readers ask and answer questions before, during and after they read a book. We also learned how to compare and contrast when reading. In Social we are learning what it means to be a good citizen. In Science we are learning all about our five senses! We are looking forward to what the next few months will bring!

Grade Two

Wow, March really flew by! What a fun month of learning we have had! This month we have really gotten into our novel Freckle Juice. We are eagerly anticipating what will happen to our main character and we are having a blast creating life-sized characters from the book with all of their attributes included. In science we are finishing up our hot and cold temperature unit with planning and executing the building of a hot chocolate insulating device. Our goal is to use our knowledge to create a device that will keep hot chocolate hot for at least 15 minutes. This month in social we have been learning all about the Inuit in Iqaluit. In the coming days we will learn about their culture and traditions as well as the natural resources, goods and services found in Iqaluit. In math we have shifted to subtraction strategies. We will be wrapping up our learning soon and will be moving on to a short unit on graphing.

Grade Three

March has been a fun-filled month! Some highlights were Teacher's Pet, the ski trip and St. Patrick's day. We are so lucky to have Mrs. Wood in our classroom and students have been enjoying all of her fun and creative learning activities. In science students have been working as builders and created some fantastic Leprechaun traps! In math we are learning all about Fractions. Social studies we are studying the country Ukraine and creating our very own nesting dolls to summarize our learning. In Language Arts we have finally finished our novel study on the BFG and students worked hard to creative self directed book review projects. It has been so nice to have parents back in the school and I look forward to seeing more of you as the school year continues!


MSCHOLASTIC

Welcome back to school students and families! The Scholastic Reading Club is now available for the 2021-22 school year. At the start of this month one member from each family should have received a paper copy of our scholastic flyer. The online version of the flyer (Digi-flyer) will be included in each month's newsletter as well as sent by email for easy online ordering.

If you are new to Scholastic you will need to sign up an account online.

To set up a new account, go to scholastic.ca/rc/digiflyer. On the left side click Reading Club, then click Create an Account. Follow the links and instructions. Purchases are by credit card; no more cheques are to be made to Scholastic Canada

It is important to note scholastic is no longer accepting payment by cheque; a credit card will now be required to pay for any Scholastic orders.



By using the code **RC846230** you can support the Amisk School and help us to buy books for our students! All orders will require the code when you get to the cart to checkout and it will remain the same for the entire year.

Supports for Families with children 0 to age 18 years of age.

During this very difficult time that we have been experiencing, I know it can be challenging to provide medical and dental needs for students. I have listed a couple of free programs that parents can access to allow children to continue to receive medical care, eye glasses, dental and other daily needs. I encourage you to review these programs.

The <u>Alberta Child Health Benefit https://www.alberta.ca/alberta-child-health-benefit.aspx</u> c overs health benefits for children in low-income households. This health plan is for children up to 18 years of age. Children who are 18 or 19 years old also qualify, if they are living at home and attending high school.

What's covered?

- Dental care
- o basic and preventative services like fillings, x-rays, examinations and teeth cleaning
- o Optical benefits
- o Eye glasses every year
- o Prescription drugs
- o The list of eligible prescription drugs found here:



Interactive Drug Benefit List

- → Some over-the-counter products, such as children's vitamins
- ♦ Ambulance services
- o Emergency ambulance trips to the nearest hospital
- o Diabetic supplies

Diabetic supplies such as injection supplies, testing strips and lancets

Talk to your doctor, dental provider, optical provider or pharmacist to learn which items are paid for by this health benefit plan.

Dental Outreach of Red Deer Program

Free urgent dental care service is available for clients ages 5 - 18 years who have: no dental insurance, lower income or trouble paying; and, who have pain, infection, visible decay or broken teeth.

Report cards and Parent Portal Information 2021-22

This year we will be continuing with online grade reporting. If you have not already please make sure you register to access your child's report cards by calling Patti at the office!

Frequently Asked Questions:

- 1. Will there still be printed copies of report cards for each reporting period? No, there will not be printed copies of report cards sent home for each reporting period for Grades 1-3.
- 2. When are the reporting periods for Kindergarten? There are 3 reporting periods; December, March and June.
- 3. Will there still be Student-led Conferences (Parent-Teacher Interviews)? Yes, Amisk School and BTPS believe that parent-teacher communication is vital in our quest to maximize student learning. There will be interviews scheduled in the fall and spring.
- 4. How do I get the information I need to set up a BTPS Parent Portal account? Contact your child's school to verify your e-mail address in our software program and let them know the child/children you are needing to set up an account for. The school will then request the Student Information Services Department to email the information to you.
- 5. Do I need a different account for each child? No, you will be able to create one account, choosing your own username and password. Once you are logged in, you will be able to access all the children that you linked to the account.
- 6. Can parents each have their own account? Yes, as long as the accounts are not created with the same email address.
- 7. Can students access the portal? Yes, they log in to the same portal, but they use their BTPS network login. They do not need to request information to create an account and they only see their data, not data of siblings.
- 8. Is the BTPS Parent Portal only available as web pages? No, there is also a mobile app called PowerSchool Mobile which is available for download in the App Store or on Google Play. Our district code for the app is GFST.
- 9. What information can I see in the BTPS Parent Portal? You will be able to see attendance, marks, comments, teacher email addresses, BTPS Transportation fees and BTPS tuition fees (not individual school fees), student demographic information, public messages on the School Bulletin and general school information.
- 10. Why is BTPS moving to electronic reporting of marks? There are a number of reasons:
 - * 24/7 access to mark and comment information will promote student-parent-teacher teamwork based on current assessment data.
 - * Mark and comment data will be accurate, timely and informative.
 - * Teachers will be commenting on individual assignments to give guidance for upcoming assignments: effective and timely feedback is a critical component of success.
 - * Alberta Education and post-secondary institutions are moving to electronic reporting and we want to help prepare parents and students.
