
- Library happens every week for students in Grades 1-3 on Fridays. Please make sure to return completed books each week so your child is able to sign new ones out.

Class Happenings!

Kindergarten

January was a very interesting month and is coming to the end. The Kindergarten students are working hard at getting back into their routine. In February we will start learning our lowercase letters and continue to work on our sight words. Please remember to continue to practice printing your letters and name. We are learning about counting, making number sets and adding and taking away things from our number sets. In Health we will be learning and talking about being kind to everyone.. In Social we will continue to talk about being respectful to others. In Gym we will be learning how to play soccer and playing as a team. February will be a great month with many events taking place in our classroom. Have a great month!!

Grade One

After our break, the students settled back into our routine fairly quickly and I am so proud of them! We worked a lot on dividing words with two syllables. We wrapped up our addition within 10 and will be moving on to subtraction within 10. The students are working so hard with reading and writing! We started discussing landmarks, symbols, and logos and how those play a role in the groups we belong to. Next we will start to discuss our rights and responsibilities. I am looking forward to February!

Grade Two

Wow, I can't believe January is almost over! This month we have started out learning about penguins and the students are very excited to be writing penguin stories. In math this month we are working addition and subtraction to 18. The students have been taught lots of strategies to help improve their fact fluency. In science we are finishing up our unit on Exploring Liquids and will be moving onto the next unit called Hot and Cold Temperatures where the students will learn about thermometers, how temperature affects us, and lots of experiments involving heating and freezing. We are wrapping up our learning about Meteghan, Nova Scotia this month with learning about their traditions, natural resources and jobs. Our next trip will be way up north where we will learn about Iqaluit, Nunavut and how it is unique to Canada.

Grade Three

January was a busy one. We are wrapping up learning about Peru and all of it's cultures and traditions. In LA we completed our BFG novel study and are looking forward to comparing the novel to the movie on February 1st. We are also mastering prefixes and suffixes and bringing these skills into our spelling words. Math has been busy and we are wrapping up our addition and subtraction unit, we will be having a test on February 2nd. Our next unit will be a fun one and all about measurement. In science we have been testing all kinds of building materials, we will be designing our own playgrounds before starting the next unit of hearing and sound.




Junior curling will continue every Wednesday with the last day on February 15th. Reminder that students need runners, helmets and proper winter clothing!

Welcome back to school students and families! The Scholastic Reading Club is now available for the 2022-23 school year. At the start of this month one member from each family should have received a paper copy of our scholastic flyer. The online version of the flyer (Digi-flyer) will be included in each month's newsletter as well as sent by email for easy online ordering.

If you are new to Scholastic you will need to sign up an account online.

To set up a new account, go to <u>scholastic.ca/rc/digiflyer</u>. On the left side click Reading Club, then click Create an Account. Follow the links and instructions. Purchases are by credit card; no more cheques are to be made to Scholastic Canada

It is important to note Scholastic is no longer accepting payment by cheque; a credit card will now be required to pay for any Scholastic orders.



By using the code **RC272526** you can support the Amisk School and help us to buy books for our students! All orders will require the code when you get to the cart to checkout and it will remain the same for the entire year.

Report cards and Parent Portal Information 20222-23

This year we will be continuing with online grade reporting. <u>If you have not already please make sure you</u> <u>register to access your child's report cards by calling Ashley at the office!</u>

Frequently Asked Questions:

- 1. Will there still be printed copies of report cards for each reporting period? No, there will not be printed copies of report cards sent home for each reporting period for Grades 1-3.
- 2. When are the reporting periods for Kindergarten? There are 3 reporting periods; December, March and June.
- 3. Will there still be Student-led Conferences (Parent-Teacher Interviews)? Yes, Amisk School and BTPS believe that parent-teacher communication is vital in our quest to maximize student learning. There will be interviews scheduled in the fall and spring.
- 4. How do I get the information I need to set up a BTPS Parent Portal account? Contact your child's school to verify your e-mail address in our software program and let them know the child/children you are needing to set up an account for. The school will then request the Student Information Services Department to email the information to you.
- 5. Do I need a different account for each child? No, you will be able to create one account, choosing your own username and password. Once you are logged in, you will be able to access all the children that you linked to the account.
- 6. Can parents each have their own account? Yes, as long as the accounts are not created with the same email address.
- 7. Can students access the portal? Yes, they log in to the same portal, but they use their BTPS network login. They do not need to request information to create an account and they only see their data, not data of siblings.
- 8. Is the BTPS Parent Portal only available as web pages? No, there is also a mobile app called PowerSchool Mobile which is available for download in the App Store or on Google Play. Our district code for the app is GFST.
- 9. What information can I see in the BTPS Parent Portal? You will be able to see attendance, marks, comments, teacher email addresses, BTPS Transportation fees and BTPS tuition fees (not individual school fees), student demographic information, public messages on the School Bulletin and general school information.
- 10. Why is BTPS moving to electronic reporting of marks? There are a number of reasons:
 - * 24/7 access to mark and comment information will promote student-parent-teacher teamwork based on current assessment data.
 - * Mark and comment data will be accurate, timely and informative.
 - * Teachers will be commenting on individual assignments to give guidance for upcoming assignments: effective and timely feedback is a critical component of success.
 - * Alberta Education and post-secondary institutions are moving to electronic reporting and we want to help prepare parents and students.
