

June 18th is the last DOWNTOWN Library day of the school year, please ensure your students are returning books over the next few weeks.


This time of year our Lost and Found is really filling up. Please make sure to take a look next time you visit our school or let you child's teacher know if you are missing something specific.

### Class Happenings!

#### Kindergarten

May has come to an end and June is here. The last month of Kindergarten is full of excitement and extra activities with lots of learning with our friends. The students have been very busy learning all about rhyming words, sounding out words and making sight word booklets. In Math the students are learning all about shapes. We are having lots of fun experimenting with the different shapes. In Health class the students are learning all about healthy eating and healthy bodies. In the gym we will play soccer, baseball and do outside activities. We had fun on our swimming trip and can't wait until we go to the Ukrainian Village. I hope everyone is enjoying the warm weather. Have a wonderful month of June!!

#### Grade One

This month in grade one our focus was on the changing of the season, plants and animals. Our focus story was Up in the Garden Down in the Dirt! With this story we worked on plant and animal needs as well as life cycles and sequencing. In math we introduced the concept of half and started our end of year math review reinforcing everything we have learned. Finally in social studies we have been focusing on our family history, traditions and values.

#### **Grade Two**

May has flown by again!! We have been super busy in Grade 2. We finished up our unit on Iqaluit and have now begun exploring Saskatoon. Since the Indigenous peoples were the first ones living in the area, we made our own tipi village. Check out the picture below!! There was so much detail put into our village! If you have time, please stop by to have a look at it yourself. In math, we finished our measurement unit and have started to further investigate numbers to 1000. We have been practicing skip counting forwards and backwards - going down is sure a lot harder than going up!!! We continue to work on our writing skills. This month we have tried to add describing words (adjectives) into our sentences. It sure makes our writing more interesting to read. We have also been mastering our STAR words - words we must know how to spell by the end of grade 2. Some of them are pretty tricky like "because" and "awesome" but we have learned some cool tricks to help us remember them. We are excited about our year end field trip and our swimming trip coming up in June.

#### **Grade Three**

I can't believe the end of Grade 3 is so close and soon this class will be off to Hughenden Public School! We have been busy learning lots of new things this past month. Students are excited to have finished up their Charlotte's Web novel study and will soon begin a book review and spider research project. In science we are learning all about living things and how plants and animals interact with the environment around them. In Social we are learning all about the culture, geography and people of our last country of study, Tunisia. In math students really impressed me in their geometry unit by making "Polygon Picasso" art projects! We will end the school year with the time unit learning how to read a clock. I am looking forward to all the fun that June will bring and the memories we will make together as a class.





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
# MSCHOLASTIC

The Scholastic Reading Club is now available for the 2023-24 school year. At the start of this month one member from each family should have received a paper copy of our scholastic flyer. The online version of the flyer (Digi-flyer) will be included in each month's newsletter as well as sent by email for easy online ordering.

# If you are new to Scholastic you will need to sign up an account online.

To set up a new account, go to <u>scholastic.ca/rc/digiflyer</u>. On the left side click Reading Club, then click Create an Account. Follow the links and instructions. Purchases are by credit card; no more cheques are to be made to Scholastic Canada

It is important to note Scholastic is no longer accepting payment by cheque; a credit card will now be required to pay for any Scholastic orders.



By using the code RC272526 you can support the Amisk School and help us to buy books for our students! All orders will require the code when you get to the cart to checkout and it will remain the same for the entire year.

#### **Report cards and Parent Portal Information 2023-24**

This year we will be continuing with online grade reporting. If you have not already please make sure you register to access your child's report cards by calling Ashley at the office!

#### **Frequently Asked Questions:**

- I. Will there still be printed copies of report cards for each reporting period? No, there will not be printed copies of report cards sent home for each reporting period for Grades 1-3.
- 2. When are the reporting periods for Kindergarten? There are 3 reporting periods; December, March and June.
- 3. Will there still be Student-led Conferences (Parent-Teacher Interviews)? Yes, Amisk School and BTPS believe that parent-teacher communication is vital in our quest to maximize student learning. There will be interviews scheduled in the fall and spring.
- 4. How do I get the information I need to set up a BTPS Parent Portal account? Contact your child's school to verify your e-mail address in our software program and let them know the child/children you are needing to set up an account for. The school will then request the Student Information Services Department to email the information to you.
- 5. Do I need a different account for each child? No, you will be able to create one account, choosing your own username and password. Once you are logged in, you will be able to access all the children that you linked to the account.
- 6. Can parents each have their own account? Yes, as long as the accounts are not created with the same email address.
- 7. Can students access the portal? Yes, they log in to the same portal, but they use their BTPS network login. They do not need to request information to create an account and they only see their data, not data of siblings.
- 8. Is the BTPS Parent Portal only available as web pages? No, there is also a mobile app called PowerSchool Mobile which is available for download in the App Store or on Google Play. Our district code for the app is GFST.
- 9. What information can I see in the BTPS Parent Portal? You will be able to see attendance, marks, comments, teacher email addresses, BTPS Transportation fees and BTPS tuition fees (not individual school fees), student demographic information, public messages on the School Bulletin and general school information.
- 10. Why is BTPS moving to electronic reporting of marks? There are a number of reasons:
  - \* 24/7 access to mark and comment information will promote student-parent-teacher teamwork based on current assessment data.
  - \* Mark and comment data will be accurate, timely and informative.
  - \* Teachers will be commenting on individual assignments to give guidance for upcoming assignments: effective and timely feedback is a critical component of success.
  - \* Alberta Education and post-secondary institutions are moving to electronic reporting and we want to help prepare parents and students.
