
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FIND US ON, FACEBOOK AND INSTAGRAM

The Kindergarten students have been working hard on learning their uppercase letters and sounds. In Math, we will be learning all about numbers in December. In Social Studies we are learning all about me. We had a wonderful Science Presentation and learned all about our five senses. In Art we will be doing lots of Christmas Crafts. The students have been working very hard on learning their Christmas songs that we will be singing at the concert on Thursday, December 12th at 1pm and 7pm. Grade 1

Wow! Can anyone believe it is December? In November we have continued to review our alphabet and solidifying our short vowel sounds. We have made great strides in reading consonant vowel consonant words fluently. We learned the two sounds that s can make and how to blend sk together when reading words. In writing we have started to label and add words and sentences to our illustrated stories. In math we finished up with our introduction to patterns unit and have started our counting strategies unit. In Social Studies we are continuing to learn all about the things that make us, us and how we are each unique. We drew self portraits and talked about how our names are important. In Science we are continuing to learn about the needs of plants and animals. We are all looking forward to December and the Christmas concert.





CLASSROOM HAPPENINGS

Grade 2

November has just flown by in Grade 2. This past month the kiddos started learning about Meteghan, Nova Scotia, and differences between this community and those in Alberta during Social Studies. They will continue this journey in December. The students have worked hard at learning about numbers up to 1000 over the past two months. Every day they are learning more and more and will put that knowledge to the test in the beginning of December. In English Language Arts, the boys and girls have continued practising their reading and writing skills and have recently starting looking at how to add ing and ed to words. They have also started a unit on fluency and present their group readings to the class after a week of practise. In Science, the students are investigating properties of materials and relating them to a purpose. They are identifying the differences between natural and processed materials and identifying natural materials and objects used by First Nations, Metis and Inuit people. In science, we have wrapped up our unit on matter and will be focussing computer science until Christmas break. Students will be applying creativity when designing instructions to achieve a desired outcome.




CLASSROOM HAPPENINGS

Grade 3

Spending Time with Family

Studies have found that spending time with family can help reduce stress, anxiety and lead to a healthier lifestyle. And "family" doesn't just mean blood relatives: It can include close friends and neighbours.

Happiness and well-being are impacted by the love, support, and acceptance we get from people around us. Spending time with our families helps us be stronger and shapes who we become. It is one important piece of building a full and meaningful life.

Be Intentional with Family Time

Make family time part of your routine:

- Go for family walks
- Spend time outdoors
- Have playtime
- Watch movies
- Have a game night
- Attend community events
- Engage in family conversation
- Plan and make meals together
- Read aloud
- Do homework together

Health Benefits of Family Time

The benefits of family time can include:

- Reduced anxiety and depression through face-to-face time with loved ones.
- Children that spend time with family tend to perform better in school.
- Children receive positive attention for good behaviour and are more likely to ask for help.
- Children's self-confidence is strengthened when they feel valued by others.
- Children learn communication skills and conflict resolution strategies.
- Children develop healthier coping skills through connection.

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Plan family time outside of your routine:

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- Go for an overnight trip
- Plan a vacation together
- Check out local attractions like a museum, fair or farmers market
- Attend community family events
- Play together at a family fun place
- Different family members plan an activity or day
- Camp in the backyard or living room
- Share traditions and make new ones

SCHOLASTIC

Welcome back to school students and families! The Scholastic Reading Club is now available for the 2023-24 school year. At the start of this month one member from each family should have received a paper copy of our scholastic flyer. The online version of the flyer (Digi-flyer) will be included in each month's newsletter as well as sent by email for easy online ordering.

If you are new to Scholastic you will need to sign up an account online.

To set up a new account, go to <u>scholastic.ca/rc/digiflyer</u>. On the left side click Reading Club, then click Create an Account. Follow the links and instructions. Purchases are by credit card; no more cheques are to be made to Scholastic Canada

It is important to note Scholastic is no longer accepting payment by cheque; a credit card will now be required to pay for any Scholastic orders.



By using the code **RC272526** you can support the Amisk School and help us to buy books for our students! All orders will require the code when you get to the cart to checkout and it will remain the same for the entire year.

All purchases will be sent directly to your home or the post office.

Report cards and Parent Portal Information 2024-25 This year we will be continuing with online grade reporting. If you have not already please make sure you register to access your child's report cards by calling Ashley at the office! Frequently Asked Questions:

1. Will there still be printed copies of report cards for each reporting period? No, there will not be printed copies of report cards sent home for each reporting period for Grades K-3.

2. Will there still be Student-led Conferences (Parent-Teacher Interviews)? Yes, Amisk School and BTPS believe that parent-teacher communication is vital in our quest to maximize student learning. There will be interviews scheduled in the fall and spring.

3. How do I get the information I need to set up a BTPS Parent Portal account? Contact your child's school to verify your e-mail address in our software program and let them know the child/children you are needing to set up an account for. The school will then request the Student Information Services Department to email the information to you.

4. Do I need a different account for each child? No, you will be able to create one account, choosing your own username and password. Once you are logged in, you will be able to access all the children that you linked to the account.
5. Can parents each have their own account? Yes, as long as the accounts are not created with the same email address.

6. Can students access the portal? Yes, they log in to the same portal, but they use their BTPS network login. They do not need to request information to create an account and they only see their data, not data of siblings.
7. Is the BTPS Parent Portal only available as web pages? No, there is also a

mobile app called PowerSchool Mobile which is available for download in the App Store or on Google Play. Our district code for the app is GFST.

8. What information can I see in the BTPS Parent Portal? You will be able to see attendance, marks, comments, teacher email addresses, BTPS Transportation fees and BTPS tuition fees (not individual school fees), student demographic information, public messages on the School Bulletin and general school information.

9. Why is BTPS moving to electronic reporting of marks? There are a number of reasons:

- * 24/7 access to mark and comment information will promote student-parentteacher teamwork based on current assessment data.
 - \cdot * Mark and comment data will be accurate, timely and informative.

 * Teachers will be commenting on individual assignments to give guidance for upcoming assignments: effective and timely feedback is a critical component of success.

• * Alberta Education and post-secondary institutions are moving to electronic reporting and we want to help prepare parents and students.
