Building a Strong Literacy Foundation

E Literacy Tip: Read aloud every day!

- 1. **Make it a routine**. Create a special time each day where you and your child sit down and enjoy a book together. Often parents find it to be most convenient at night right before bed because it is an effective way to settle down and relax before bedtime, but it is important to find a routine that works best for you.
- 2. **Discuss the book.** As you read the book, stop and talk about the pictures, model thinking strategies, make observations, ask your child questions, and encourage them to make predictions.
- 3. **Model appropriate fluency and expression.** When you are reading to your child, model how you would want them to read the story: Clearly, well-paced, and with appropriate expression.
- 4. **Make it fun!** Bring enthusiasm and excitement to each book. Choose books with funny words, characters, or plots that are high-interest for your child. Try reading in a fort with a flashlight. Another option is to include the family pet or a sibling in the read aloud.




Thank you to Sarah from BRITE for putting on such a fantastic program for the students!

Wow January flew by and February will be a busy month with many fun activities and learning throughout the month. We will now be having a three day week until the end of the school year. The Kindergarten students have been working hard on learning their lowercase letters and sounds. In Math, we will be learning about addition and subtraction of numbers.. In Social Studies we are learning all about respect and kindness. In Science will be learning about our 5 senses and doing some fun experiments. In Art we will be making a Valentine bag to hold all of our Valentine cards and making some stain glass hearts. The students have been working very hard all month and have been learning lots of wonderful things. They are so excited to have a Valentine Party, go skiing and do Random Act of Kindness activities throughout the month. Please enjoy the month of February and hopefully the weather is nice and we can all enjoy sometime outside!!









Grade 1

January flew by! I hope that everyone had a relaxing winter break. We got right back into things when students got back. This month, we completed the review of the alphabet and learned about blends (sl, gr, tr, dr, etc.) Students are really gaining great strides in their reading fluency. I am so proud of them! In Writing, we continued to learned about proper sentence structure, forming letters properly, and we made our first class book! In Math we finished up our counting strategies unit where students learned how to count to 20 forwards and backwards, students learned how to count on, one more/less than a number, how to compare numbers within 20, and learned how to represent numbers using a number chart, a ten frame, and base 10 blocks. In Science we have been learning about plants and animals native to Alberta. In Social Studies we continue to learn about the groups students belong to, with a focus on family and school community. February is going to be a busy busy month and we are looking forward to it!






Grade 2



January has come and gone in second grade. This past month the kiddos continued their adventure to Meteghan, Nova Scotia, learning about Acadians and their important contributions to Canadian society during Social Studies. The students have also worked hard at learning about how to make different types of graphs. Starting in February, the kids will begin a unit on addition and subtraction. In English Language Arts, the boys and girls have continued practising their reading and writing skills and have also been looking at story structures. They have also started a new unit on fluency in an attempt to advance on their reading levels. This month in science the students have been learning about sound energy and how it behaves in various ways and its characteristics. In February we will shift to light energy where the students will discover sources of light, how it behaves and how it travels.



Grade 3



Wow!!. Where did the month of January go??

We have been busy leaning to add and subtract 2 and 3 digit numbers with and without regrouping. It's really not that hard anymore!!!

In language arts we have continued on with our grammar studies. We have learned how adjectives and adverbs make writing so much more interesting. We finished up our study of Greek Myths and have started a unit on Comics and Graphic Novels. We are looking forward to writing our own short comic strip and a graphic novel.

In social we are nearing the end of our unit on India. We have learned so many cool facts and bits of information about this country. We even watched a video about how the men tie a turban and an Indian wedding. Our next country we are travelling to is Peru. We will be learning lots of cool things about that country as well.

In Science we have been exploring how forces can relate to changes in movement. They have learned about Newton's 1st Law and different contact forces including applied, friction, tension, spring/elastic. In the next month the students will be learning about simple machines!





Welcome back to school students and families! The Scholastic Reading Club is now available for the 2024-25 school year. At the start of this month one member from each family should have received a paper copy of our scholastic flyer. The online version of the flyer (Digi-flyer) will be included in each month's newsletter as well as sent by email for easy online ordering.

If you are new to Scholastic you will need to sign up an account online.

To set up a new account, go to scholastic.ca/rc/digiflyer. On the left side click Reading Club, then click Create an Account. Follow the links and instructions. Purchases are by credit card; no more cheques are to be made to Scholastic Canada

It is important to note Scholastic is no longer accepting payment by cheque; a credit card will now be required to pay for any Scholastic orders.



By using the code **RC272526** you can support the Amisk School and help us to buy books for our students! All orders will require the code when you get to the cart to checkout and it will remain the same for the entire year.

All purchases will be sent directly to your home or the post office.

Report cards and Parent Portal Information 2024-25 This year we will be continuing with online grade reporting. If you have not already please make sure you register to access your child's report cards by calling Ashley at the office! Frequently Asked Questions:

- 1. Will there still be printed copies of report cards for each reporting period?

 No, there will not be printed copies of report cards sent home for each reporting period for Grades K-3.
- 2. Will there still be Student-led Conferences (Parent-Teacher Interviews)? Yes, Amisk School and BTPS believe that parent-teacher communication is vital in our quest to maximize student learning. There will be interviews scheduled in the fall and spring.
- 3. How do I get the information I need to set up a BTPS Parent Portal account? Contact your child's school to verify your e-mail address in our software program and let them know the child/children you are needing to set up an account for. The school will then request the Student Information Services Department to email the information to you.
- 4. Do I need a different account for each child? No, you will be able to create one account, choosing your own username and password. Once you are logged in, you will be able to access all the children that you linked to the account.
- 5. Can parents each have their own account? Yes, as long as the accounts are not created with the same email address.
- 6. Can students access the portal? Yes, they log in to the same portal, but they use their BTPS network login. They do not need to request information to create an account and they only see their data, not data of siblings.
- 7. Is the BTPS Parent Portal only available as web pages? No, there is also a mobile app called PowerSchool Mobile which is available for download in the App Store or on Google Play. Our district code for the app is GFST.
- 8. What information can I see in the BTPS Parent Portal? You will be able to see attendance, marks, comments, teacher email addresses, BTPS Transportation fees and BTPS tuition fees (not individual school fees), student demographic information, public messages on the School Bulletin and general school information.
- 9. Why is BTPS moving to electronic reporting of marks? There are a number of reasons:
- * 24/7 access to mark and comment information will promote student-parentteacher teamwork based on current assessment data.
 - * Mark and comment data will be accurate, timely and informative.
- * Teachers will be commenting on individual assignments to give guidance for upcoming assignments: effective and timely feedback is a critical component of success.
- * Alberta Education and post-secondary institutions are moving to electronic reporting and we want to help prepare parents and students.
