Numeracy Tips for Families

Here are some simple and fun numeracy tips to support your child's learning at home:

<u>Count Everyday Objects:</u> Whether it's counting snacks, steps, or toys, encourage your child to count things they see around the house or outside. This helps them build number sense in a meaningful way.

<u>Use Playful Math Games:</u> Board games like Chutes and Ladders, Snakes and Ladders, or card games like Go Fish help practice counting and number recognition while having fun.

<u>Talk About Shapes and Sizes:</u> Point out different shapes around the house or in nature, and discuss their attributes (e.g., "This box is a rectangle because it has four sides, and two are longer than the others").

<u>Sort and Group Objects:</u> Sorting items (e.g., buttons, blocks, or coins) into groups by color, size, or type helps children understand patterns and organization, key skills for later math concepts.

Incorporate Math Into Daily Routines: Whether it's setting the table, cooking, or running errands, talk about numbers and measurements in practical situations (e.g., "We need 2 eggs for this recipe!" or "How many apples are in the basket?").

<u>Use Technology Wisely:</u> Educational apps and websites can make math practice fun. Look for age-appropriate games that focus on number recognition, addition, and subtraction.

By making numeracy part of your child's daily routine, you're helping them develop a strong foundation for future learning. Enjoy the process together!

Kindergarten

February has been a fun filled, busy, exciting and adventurous month! The Kindergarten students have been busy learning, celebrating valentine's day, listening to stories during Freedom to read day, skating and skiing in gym class, being kind and doing lots of Random Acts of Kindness throughout the month of February. In Literacy the students are continuing to learn their letters and sounds. In Math they have been working on adding two sets together and printing their numbers. In Social Studies they have been busy learning all about being me! In Science, the students have been learning about their 5 senses. The weather is warming up and the students have been so excited about being able to have recesses back outside. March will be another busy month with lots of fun learning activities planned. Grade 1

What a busy month February was! February was full of fun and exciting activities as well as bus cancellations due to cold weather. We are looking forward to warmer days! This month, we started learning about digraphs (ck, th, sh, ch, wh, ph), as well as continued to practice reading words with beginning and ending blends. In writing, we have started to learn about creating stories with a beginning, a middle, and an end. We continue to solidify our knowledge with previous learned heart words as well as learning new heart words. In Science we completed our living systems unit, and are looking forward to starting our next one - Energy. In Social Studies we are working on learning about the groups we belong to - focusing on family, school and our community. We are looking forward to March!






Grade 2

February seems to have just flown by. Over the last 28 days, the kids completed their adventure to Meteghan, Nova Scotia, learning about Acadians and have headed off to Iqaluit, Nunavut, to learn about Inuit culture. We will even have a special presentation about the Inuit early in the month of March. A unit on graphing was completed in early February and the students have started on addition and subtraction within 100. In English Language Arts, the boys and girls have continued practising their reading and writing skills and have also worked on their public speaking, which will continue into the next month. They are also looking at different parts of speech such as nouns, verbs, adverbs and adjectives. This month in science the students have been exploring light energy. We have had the opportunity to do a lot of investigations into the characteristics of light. The next unit we will start learning about will be earth systems where we will investigate Earth, its landforms, its bodies of water, and its relationship to the Sun.

Grade 3



In math, we completed addition and subtraction of 3-digit numbers. What we thought would be hard, turned out to be not that bad. Now, we are excited to dive into multiplication and division. In our spare moments we are practicing our multiplication tables so we can move up the levels and become a Black Belt Ninja.

Peru is our next stop on our around the world tour of fascinating places to visit. We certainly did enjoy learning about India and how different it is from life here in Canada. We are curious about what life is like in Peru.

For phys. ed this past month we have explored different ways to have fun on the scooter board. We played scooter hockey and even tried a bit of scooter basketball. Once the weather warmed up, we adventured outside with the snowshoes. Skating was also a fun activity this month.

In Scence, we are finishing up our energy unit and are moving on to earth systems where the students will analyze changes in Earth's surface and explain how its layers hold stories of the past.

















Welcome back to school students and families! The Scholastic Reading Club is now available for the 2024-25 school year. At the start of this month one member from each family should have received a paper copy of our scholastic flyer. The online version of the flyer (Digi-flyer) will be included in each month's newsletter as well as sent by email for easy online ordering.

If you are new to Scholastic you will need to sign up an account online.

To set up a new account, go to scholastic.ca/rc/digiflyer. On the left side click Reading Club, then click Create an Account. Follow the links and instructions. Purchases are by credit card; no more cheques are to be made to Scholastic Canada

It is important to note Scholastic is no longer accepting payment by cheque; a credit card will now be required to pay for any Scholastic orders.



By using the code **RC272526** you can support the Amisk School and help us to buy books for our students! All orders will require the code when you get to the cart to checkout and it will remain the same for the entire year.

All purchases will be sent directly to your home or the post office.

Report cards and Parent Portal Information 2024-25 This year we will be continuing with online grade reporting. If you have not already please make sure you register to access your child's report cards by calling Ashley at the office! Frequently Asked Questions:

- 1. Will there still be printed copies of report cards for each reporting period?

 No, there will not be printed copies of report cards sent home for each reporting period for Grades K-3.
- 2. Will there still be Student-led Conferences (Parent-Teacher Interviews)? Yes, Amisk School and BTPS believe that parent-teacher communication is vital in our quest to maximize student learning. There will be interviews scheduled in the fall and spring.
- 3. How do I get the information I need to set up a BTPS Parent Portal account?

 Contact your child's school to verify your e-mail address in our software program and let them know the child/children you are needing to set up an account for. The school will then request the Student Information Services

 Department to email the information to you.
- 4. Do I need a different account for each child? No, you will be able to create one account, choosing your own username and password. Once you are logged in, you will be able to access all the children that you linked to the account.
- 5. Can parents each have their own account? Yes, as long as the accounts are not created with the same email address.
- 6. Can students access the portal? Yes, they log in to the same portal, but they use their BTPS network login. They do not need to request information to create an account and they only see their data, not data of siblings.
- 7. Is the BTPS Parent Portal only available as web pages? No, there is also a mobile app called PowerSchool Mobile which is available for download in the App Store or on Google Play. Our district code for the app is GFST.
- 8. What information can I see in the BTPS Parent Portal? You will be able to see attendance, marks, comments, teacher email addresses, BTPS Transportation fees and BTPS tuition fees (not individual school fees), student demographic information, public messages on the School Bulletin and general school information.
- 9. Why is BTPS moving to electronic reporting of marks? There are a number of reasons:
- * 24/7 access to mark and comment information will promote student-parentteacher teamwork based on current assessment data.
 - * Mark and comment data will be accurate, timely and informative.
- * Teachers will be commenting on individual assignments to give guidance for upcoming assignments: effective and timely feedback is a critical component of success.
- * Alberta Education and post-secondary institutions are moving to electronic reporting and we want to help prepare parents and students.
