

In Math we have started our measurement unit, and the students have been enjoying measuring everything in our classroom. In Social Studies we have been learning all about being a good friend and citizen. We have painted, colored and sketched in Art class this month. Our new unit in Science is learning all about the environment. In the Gym we played soccer, played lots of games with hula hoops and bean bags and our favorite game right now is Musical hoops. We have lots of fun activities planned for the month of May. Enjoy the month of May and all the wonderful things that Spring brings.



# CLASSROOM HAPPENINGS



## Grade 1

Hello Spring! The school year has flown by! This month in phonics we learned about all the different jobs of silent e - how it makes the vowel say its name, changes the hard c sound to soft c and changes the sound of g. In reading we focused a lot on narrative nonfiction and nonfiction books and how they are different than fiction books. In math we continue to work on addition and subtraction and have been focusing on word problems and deciding when to use addition and subtraction. In Science we continue to learn about energy - how different objects and animals move by direction, speed and pathways. In Social Studies we made a map of our school, made our own logos for a group we belong to, and discussed the differences between rights and responsibilities' at home, at school and within our community. We are so looking forward to May and all the exciting activities that will be going on!





# CLASSROOM HAPPENINGS

## Grade 2











A trip through addition and subtraction complete with a trek to Iqaluit and discovery of all the wonderful adventures that folk tales and legends offer us comprised the month of April. The Grade 2 students wrapped themselves in understanding about Inuit culture and the far north during Social Studies. We are now travelling a little closer to home taking a glimpse of all the Prairies has to offer. All the ways to complete addition and subtraction problems within 100, including using base-ten blocks, a hundreds chart, splitting and the standard algorithm, kept the kids busy in mathematics over the past month. They're now jumping into patterns and fractions. Lunch with Goldilocks and the Three Bears, a conquest of the West alongside Paul Bunyan and skipping toward grandma's house hand-in-hand with Little Red Riding Hood filled the minds of second-graders as they explored the world of folk tales and legends this past month. In May, the kids will continue to work toward improving their reading and writing skills. They'll also dive into onomatopoeia, alliteration and repitition. This month in science the students created their own islands featuring their understanding of landforms, UNESCO Heritage Sites and bodies of water. They have also been learning how to describe the relationship between time and Earth revolving around the Sun and how Earth's rotation connects to patterns of day and night. Next up, students will learn how human actions can help or harm plants and animals, explore the life cycles of different living things, and discover how First Nations, Métis, and Inuit peoples show respect and care for the land, plants, and animals through their cultural practices.





# CLASSKOOM HAPPENINGS

### Grade 3



As we finish off April, we remember all the learning that we did. We mastered patterns and can create increasing and decreasing and repeating patterns. Now we are excited to learn about how cool fractions are and that we use them a lot in many different places.

Language arts still finds us exploring our authors. We have discovered that reading is more enjoyable with exciting sentences. Did you know there are 4 different ways authors grab your attention when they begin a story? We are trying our hands at creating interesting story beginnings by using a question, special sound words (onomatopoeia), dialogue, and actions. We will continue to explore the writings of Dav Pilkey, Ron Roy, Mo Willems, and James and Kim Dean.

Peru is so interesting. Did you know that there are special mountains called the Rainbow Mountains? We are now learning about life in villages, the rainforest, and the mountain areas. The money they use is call Sol. One of our dollars is about 2.65 SOL. It sounds like a great place to visit.

This month in science, students learned about how layers of Earth have preserved fossils. The students created trioramas based on research they learned about a dinosaur that used to roam the land in Alberta! Next up. students will explore food chains, how plants and animals survive and interact, and ways to protect local environments, while learning from the knowledge and respectful practices of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit peoples.



Welcome back to school students and families! The Scholastic Reading Club is now available for the 2024-25 school year. At the start of this month one member from each family should have received a paper copy of our scholastic flyer. The online version of the flyer (Digi-flyer) will be included in each month's newsletter as well as sent by email for easy online ordering.

# If you are new to Scholastic you will need to sign up an account online.

To set up a new account, go to <a href="scholastic.ca/rc/digiflyer">scholastic.ca/rc/digiflyer</a>. On the left side click Reading Club, then click Create an Account. Follow the links and instructions. Purchases are by credit card; no more cheques are to be made to Scholastic Canada

It is important to note Scholastic is no longer accepting payment by cheque; a credit card will now be required to pay for any Scholastic orders.



By using the code **RC272526** you can support the Amisk School and help us to buy books for our students! All orders will require the code when you get to the cart to checkout and it will remain the same for the entire year.

All purchases will be sent directly to your home or the post office.

Report cards and Parent Portal Information 2024-25
This year we will be continuing with online grade reporting. If you have not already please make sure you register to access your child's report cards by calling Ashley at the office!

Frequently Asked Questions:

- 1. Will there still be printed copies of report cards for each reporting period?

  No, there will not be printed copies of report cards sent home for each reporting period for Grades K-3.
- 2. Will there still be Student-led Conferences (Parent-Teacher Interviews)? Yes, Amisk School and BTPS believe that parent-teacher communication is vital in our quest to maximize student learning. There will be interviews scheduled in the fall and spring.
- 3. How do I get the information I need to set up a BTPS Parent Portal account? Contact your child's school to verify your e-mail address in our software program and let them know the child/children you are needing to set up an account for. The school will then request the Student Information Services Department to email the information to you.
- 4. Do I need a different account for each child? No, you will be able to create one account, choosing your own username and password. Once you are logged in, you will be able to access all the children that you linked to the account.
- 5. Can parents each have their own account? Yes, as long as the accounts are not created with the same email address.
- 6. Can students access the portal? Yes, they log in to the same portal, but they use their BTPS network login. They do not need to request information to create an account and they only see their data, not data of siblings.
- 7. Is the BTPS Parent Portal only available as web pages? No, there is also a mobile app called PowerSchool Mobile which is available for download in the App Store or on Google Play. Our district code for the app is GFST.
- 8. What information can I see in the BTPS Parent Portal? You will be able to see attendance, marks, comments, teacher email addresses, BTPS Transportation fees and BTPS tuition fees (not individual school fees), student demographic information, public messages on the School Bulletin and general school information.
- 9. Why is BTPS moving to electronic reporting of marks? There are a number of reasons:
- \* 24/7 access to mark and comment information will promote student-parentteacher teamwork based on current assessment data.
  - · \* Mark and comment data will be accurate, timely and informative.
- \* Teachers will be commenting on individual assignments to give guidance for upcoming assignments: effective and timely feedback is a critical component of success.
- \* Alberta Education and post-secondary institutions are moving to electronic reporting and we want to help prepare parents and students.
