They learned many things about the 5 senses, watched a dinosaur movie and a Superpower Dogs movie and had so much fun playing in the The Curious City. The swimming trip was very fun for the class, with many memories being made. Way to go Amisk School on the great fundraiser you did for the Jump Rope for Heart. So fun being able to throw pies at your teachers. The students have been practicing for our Track and Field Day, and are looking forward to it. We will be finishing up with all our last units in literacy, numeracy, social, science, gym, health and art. I am wishing everyone a great month of June, enjoy the warm weather and making memories with your family!!

CLASSIKOOM HAPPENINGS



Grade 1

We are in the home stretch! What a wonderful year it has been. In literacy we continue to work hard on reviewing and learning new heart words. We finished up with our silent e and have been learning different word ending such as es, ed, and ing. We are currently learning about closed and open syllables. We wrapped up learning about nonfiction books and have moved on to to Fairy Tales where we learn about what makes a story a fairy tale, comparing different versions, and problem and solution. In writing students have been working hard at adding adjectives and verbs into their stories and we have started learning about the writing process and getting a story ready to be published. In math we continued to learn about addition and subtraction, and we are currently working on skip counting and the importance of grouping numbers. In Social Studies we learned all about rights and responsibilities and why it is important to take care of our environment. In Science we continue to learn about energy and how things move via direction, pathways and speed. We have been doing a ton of scientific investigations throughout this unit, including using robots! June is a very busy month and will go by so fast!





CLASSROOM HAPPENINGS

Grade 2











It's incredible that nine months have nearly passed since these wonderful, funny and eager to learn children first walked through the Grade 2 doors. The students enjoyed a quick trip through the Prairie provinces over the last 31 days learning about Ukrainian culture, natural resources and goods and services during Social Studies. We are building a base of knowledge about the history of Amisk and area. Fractions, including the creation of Fraction-Pillars or coloured-ball caterpillars split into fractions, comprised the early part of Mathematics during the past month. A look at patterns and 2D and 3D shapes in geometry have occupied the boys and girls the last week or two and will continue to into the month of June. A new focus on learning vocabulary words while having a bit of fun exploring different texts has jumped into the fray during May. We'll continue this journey over the next four weeks plus gain a bit of practise on our non-fiction writing skills. It should be an exciting, fun-filled and educational adventure until the end of June.

This month, students have been learning about the life cycles of plants and animals and how these cycles can be represented through diagrams, models, and stories. They've explored the similarities between parents and their offspring and have begun comparing different life cycles. In the weeks ahead, students will learn how human behaviours—both positive and negative—can impact plants and animals. They'll also explore how First Nations, Métis, and Inuit cultures show care for land, plants, and animals by treating them as equals and using natural resources respectfully and responsibly.





GLASSKUUM HAPPENINGS

Grade 3

May has been a super busy month. We finished exploring fractions and measurement. Next up we will be exploring geometry and time. Those should be fun units in math to explore.

In Language Arts we have started a unit exploring some cool authors. First we learned about Dav Pilkey. He writes some really cool graphic novels. Did you know that his teacher sent him out of the room because he couldn't sit still and tore up the pages he was drawing on? Poor Dav!! Next we are exploring Mo Willems. Did you know he helped to create <u>Sesame Street</u>? He likes to write stories for illiterate adults to help them learn to read. It will be interesting to learn about our next authors - James and Kim Dean and Ron Roy.

In Social, we continue to explore Peru. They have a special celebration similar to our Christmas called Noche Buena. They also have a special celebration on June 24 to celebrate the shortest day of the year- Inti Raymi.

Students have been learning how plants and animals use their senses to respond to things like food, water, light, and temperature to survive. We've explored how animals detect predators or prey and how plants react to their surroundings. We have learned how animals are classified as herbivores, carnivores, or omnivores, and how they interact in food chains. Over the next month we will discuss how to protect local environments by interacting respectfully with nature, recognizing animal crossings, and learning from First Nations, Métis, and Inuit knowledge about seasonal patterns and animal behaviour.



Welcome back to school students and families! The Scholastic Reading Club is now available for the 2024-25 school year. At the start of this month one member from each family should have received a paper copy of our scholastic flyer. The online version of the flyer (Digi-flyer) will be included in each month's newsletter as well as sent by email for easy online ordering.

If you are new to Scholastic you will need to sign up an account online.

To set up a new account, go to scholastic.ca/rc/digiflyer. On the left side click Reading Club, then click Create an Account. Follow the links and instructions. Purchases are by credit card; no more cheques are to be made to Scholastic Canada

It is important to note Scholastic is no longer accepting payment by cheque; a credit card will now be required to pay for any Scholastic orders.



By using the code **RC272526** you can support the Amisk School and help us to buy books for our students! All orders will require the code when you get to the cart to checkout and it will remain the same for the entire year.

Report cards and Parent Portal Information 2024-25
This year we will be continuing with online grade reporting. If you have not already please make sure you register to access your child's report cards by calling Ashley at the office!

Frequently Asked Questions:

- 1. Will there still be printed copies of report cards for each reporting period?

 No, there will not be printed copies of report cards sent home for each reporting period for Grades K-3.
- 2. Will there still be Student-led Conferences (Parent-Teacher Interviews)? Yes, Amisk School and BTPS believe that parent-teacher communication is vital in our quest to maximize student learning. There will be interviews scheduled in the fall and spring.
- 3. How do I get the information I need to set up a BTPS Parent Portal account? Contact your child's school to verify your e-mail address in our software program and let them know the child/children you are needing to set up an account for. The school will then request the Student Information Services Department to email the information to you.
- 4. Do I need a different account for each child? No, you will be able to create one account, choosing your own username and password. Once you are logged in, you will be able to access all the children that you linked to the account.
- 5. Can parents each have their own account? Yes, as long as the accounts are not created with the same email address.
- 6. Can students access the portal? Yes, they log in to the same portal, but they use their BTPS network login. They do not need to request information to create an account and they only see their data, not data of siblings.
- 7. Is the BTPS Parent Portal only available as web pages? No, there is also a mobile app called PowerSchool Mobile which is available for download in the App Store or on Google Play. Our district code for the app is GFST.
- 8. What information can I see in the BTPS Parent Portal? You will be able to see attendance, marks, comments, teacher email addresses, BTPS Transportation fees and BTPS tuition fees (not individual school fees), student demographic information, public messages on the School Bulletin and general school information.
- 9. Why is BTPS moving to electronic reporting of marks? There are a number of reasons:
- * 24/7 access to mark and comment information will promote student-parentteacher teamwork based on current assessment data.
 - * Mark and comment data will be accurate, timely and informative.
- * Teachers will be commenting on individual assignments to give guidance for upcoming assignments: effective and timely feedback is a critical component of success.
- * Alberta Education and post-secondary institutions are moving to electronic reporting and we want to help prepare parents and students.
